



The Actor Awards Nomenclature

Lauded by critics for its style, simplicity and genuine warmth, The Actor Awards presented by SAG-AFTRA, which made its debut in 1995, has become one of the industry's most prized honors. These guidelines are intended to preserve the integrity, prestige and honor of The Actor Awards® and to assist media in maintaining accuracy.

Please note: The Actor® name and statuette, and the phrase “**I Am an Actor™**” are legally protected against unauthorized uses and infringements. Further legal and usage information is available at <http://actorawards.org/media-pr/media-guidelines>.

- The name of the event is **The 32nd Annual Actor Awards**. The only acceptable nicknames are **The Actor Awards**, **Actor Awards**, or **The Actors**.
- The official hashtag is **#ActorAwards** and the official social handle is **@ActorAwards**.
- The name of the statuette presented to the honorees is **The Actor®**.
- SAG-AFTRA's highest accolade is the SAG-AFTRA Life Achievement Award for career achievement and humanitarian accomplishment. It is NOT called the Lifetime Achievement Award.

Remember: The performers union that presents the The Actor Awards is SAG-AFTRA. Since the merger of Screen Actors Guild and the American Federation of Television and Radio Artists in 2012, SAG as a stand-alone entity ceased to exist.
